

Upper Division Academics Guide

We know that you are committed to ensuring that your dancer receives all of the tools they need to become a well-rounded individual, including excellent academic training; Ballet West shares this goal. To this end, Ballet West has met with various academic institutions in order to provide you with options that will meet your student's educational needs. Some options offer rigorous traditional style education with structures course, while others offer flexible schedules for students who prefer to work at their own pace.

Each of these institutions have committed to ensuring that you student will be able to attend their full ballet schedule at the Ballet West Academy while still being able to work towards obtaining a High School Diploma; many will allow your student to get a jump-start on college courses.

Once you have reviewed this packet and researched the options, please feel free to contact the schools directly to discuss your student's needs, or even arrand a tour of the campus. Be sure to mention that your student attends Ballet West Academy. Each school looks forward to meeting with you and your student to make sure that you find the perfect fit for your dancer's academic training. Ballet West will not act as an intermediary between you and the school, and will not take on responsibility for your student's academic training, but many of these schools will assign a mentor to oversee your student's academic progress.

You are not required to select one of these options in order for your dancer to attend Ballet West Academy, but we know that these schools will work with you to achieve the best results for your dancer.

Most of these options are tuition-free for students who have a legal guardian paying taxes in the State of Utah. If you student will not have a legal guardian paying taxes in Utah, the schools will charge a fee that will then be paid to the Utah Department of Education. The schools will be able to help you determine the amount, if applicable. You may also be able to find a charter school in your home state that allows distance-learning options. This would allow your dancer to complete online courses and graduate from high school through his or her home school.

Public transportation stops are an easy walk from each of these schools.



Rowland Hall

Ballet West Academy students who enroll at Rowland Hall enjoy the unique opportunity to experience premiere dance training and pursue a rigorous college preparatory curriculum at Rowland Hall, one of the top schools in the Intermountain West.

The program is modeled after the successful Rowmark Ski Academy within Rowland Hall. Founded in 1982, Rowmark has a successfully educated and trained more than 170 student/athletes—including NCAA All-Americans, World Champions and Olympians.

The program provides an unparalleled combination of academics and dance training. While we strive for artistic and academic excellence, our primary goal is to develop *personal excellence*, organizational skills, independence, responsibility, and integrity—attributes that student/dancers take with them to college and adulthood, regardless of what career they may ultimately choose.

In partnership with the student and their parents, the Upper School Assistant Principal at Rowland Hall works to develop a course of study that positions the student for both academic and artistic success. Full-time students at Rowland Hall typically take five academic core courses per year—English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and World Language. The training program at Ballet West dictates that student/dancers take a recommended three (with no more than four) yearlong academic courses.

Typically, Ballet West dancers' academic classes will be scheduled in the first three (or four) periods in the Rowland Hall daily schedule. This helps facilitate dancers' attendance in morning classes from November-March, when our rotation schedule changes to facilitate attendance for students in both Rowmark and Ballet West Academy. Co-enrollment in Ballet West Academy and Rowland Hall may limit certain options for the academic program. While the school cannot guarantee that dancers will have access to ever core class offered, they promise to make available all credits needed to graduate. Students who wish to take more than the recommended core classes may enroll in summer college courses for high school students or online/independent study courses.

Innovations Early College High School

The mission of Innovations Early College High School is to provide a robust, personalized learning environment without the constraints of the traditional high school. Through this unique pedagogy, students are taught in a blended learning classroom, which is a form of instruction that uses face-to-face traditional instruction, along with self-paced, individualized digital content. As such, students have control of the time, path, pace, and place for their learning. With the pivot to more online options, students are able to move through school easily, and they have a high early graduation rate.

A strong mentoring program enhances the personalization of each student. Each teacher acts as s mentor to approximately 40 students. Mentors are assigned randomly to students and become counselor coach, cheerleader, and motivator for the student until they graduate. Student and parent survey responses have stated that the mentor program succeeds because of the dedication of the teaching staff. Each mentor works individually with the student to plan their educational path and keep them on pace. The mentors, along with the school counselor, plan for dual credit opportunities that allow students to earn college credit while fulfilling the requirements for high school graduation.

Innovations Early College High School is a choice school in the Salt Lake City School District with direct ties to Salt Lake City Community College. All juniors and seniors are expected to earn college credit while in high school. Students can continue their education after completing high school course by enrolling in Concurrent Enrollment options with the goal of completing one year or more of their college education through Salt Lake Community College.

Salt Lake School for the Performing Arts (SPA), is a tuition-free public charter high school. We currently offer academic tracks in Dance, Media, Music, and Theatre. SPA shares courses with Highland High School, and offers concurrent enrollment courses in partnership with Salt Lake Community College and the University of Utah. Students are required to commit to taking at least three performing arts courses. SPA offers students three unique pathways of learning to fit their individual needs.

• Option 2: SLSPA Hybrid Schedule

Students will have English and Math courses in person, but will complete other course requirements through online platforms. All courses are located on SPA's campus. This model allows students to have access to the entire course catalog, while benefiting form a mix of in-person and online instruction. Students will be monitored and supported during weekly check-ins to make sure they are on track in all of their coursework

Utah Virtual Academy is a college and career ready school dedicated to inspiring and empowering students through an educational experience tailored to each student's needs.

Full-time high school students can take advanced courses, including concurrent enrollment and dual credit courses through local Applied Technology Colleges. Students can earn a high school diploma while completing college credit courses at a deeply discounted cost. Courses may be completed synchronously or asynchronously. UTVA provides a comprehensive framework for school counselors to promote a whole child approach to academic/learning, life/career, multicultural/global citizenship, and social/emotional development for each student. This K-12 framework is also systemic in that it ensures student supports are deeply ingrained in the system to improve outcomes for students, not only academically but also for lifelong success.

Students seeking supplemental online courses (part-time) can participate in the <u>Utah Statewide</u> <u>Online Education Program (SOEP)</u>, students in grades 6-12 attending a private school, homeschool, or a public school can take up to six credits with UTVA.




